LEADWEST LAUNCHES ADVOCACY PRIORITIES AHEAD OF THE 2025 FEDERAL ELECTION

In January, LeadWest officially launched its Federal Election Advocacy Priorities with a theme of "Invest in Melbourne's West".

LeadWest Chair Cr Dr Phillip Zada said the benefits of infrastructure investment went beyond just the building of new facilities.

Investment is vital to supporting sustainable growth, easing the cost-of-living pressures, and breaking the cycle of high unemployment, traffic congestion and poor public transport options in Melbourne's west.

The upcoming Federal Election offers an important opportunity to redress funding imbalance.

CANBERRA VISIT A SUCCESS!

In February, LeadWest met with federal parliament MPs including the Hon Catherine King Minister for Infrastructure, Transport, Regional Development & Local Government: Assistant Minister for Foreign Affairs the Hon Tim Watts: Senator Steph Hodgins-May from the Australian Greens; Dr Daniel Mulino, Member for Fraser, Sam Rae, Member for Hawke, and Peter Khalil Member for Wills. The delegation also met with senior advisers from the office of the Opposition Leader Mr. Peter Dutton as well as the office of the Hon Kristy McBain, Minister for Regional Development, Local Government and Territories.

The visit to Canberra provided a great opportunity to discuss unlocking investment to provide real benefits for Melbourne's west.

ADVOCACY WIN

\$1.1 BILLION TO FIX THE WESTERN HWY

LeadWest has enthusiastically welcomed a game-changing announcement from the Hon Catherine King, Minister for Infrastructure Transport, Regional Development and Local Government, committing \$1.1 billion to fix the Western Highway.

The Western Highway is an aged and rural-standard highway. It is a critical national road link and is the second largest freight carrier of any national highway, carrying more than 5,400 trucks and around 86,000 vehicles on the stretch of highway between Melton and Caroline Springs daily.

LeadWest pushed hard for the upgrade whilst in Canberra and see this as a huge win. The Western Highway was also the site where LeadWest launched its Federal Election Advocacy Priorities campaign.

MELBOURNE AIRPORT RAIL RECEIVES \$2 BILLION BOOST!

A new era of transport connectivity is on its way.

LeadWest is delighted that the 6 March Melton Hwy announcement came hot on the heels of the previous week's announcement by the Albanese Government for an additional \$2 billion funding towards transforming Sunshine Station as part of the Melbourne Airport Rail project (MAR).

The Prime Minister also announced that the Victorian Government will bring forward its Melbourne Airport Rail funding to enable the works at Sunshine Station to begin earlier and transform it into a hub for regional rail services connecting to Melbourne Airport.

Bringing forward the works at Sunshine Station will also support plans for the electrification of the Wyndham and Melton lines. ADVOCACY WINS

LEADWEST WELCOMES BILLIONS IN INFRASTRUCTURE FUNDING FOR MELBOURNE'S WEST

The recent wave of infrastructure funding is hugely exciting. In addition to 15 new school bus specials for Wyndham and Melton we have welcomed:

- √ \$2 billion for Melbourne Airport Rail
- √ \$15 million towards the
 Plumpton Aquatic Centre
- √ \$5 million for Footscray's
 Creative West arts and cultural
 hub
- √ \$1.1 billion upgrade to the Western Highway

This ticks off five of our key federal advocacy asks. We look forward to seeing these projects come to fruition.

STILL PUSHING FOR A BETTER BUS NETORK

LeadWest continues to campaign for better bus services in Melbourne's west and has been calling for a major overhaul of the state's bus network urging State Government to prioritise Melbourne's west.

Over the last 12 months LeadWest has met with many MPs and State Government Ministers to share concerns about the need for improved transport services as a high priority for people living in the west.

LeadWest has welcomed the Allan Government's announcement of an additional 15 new school bus specials in the fast-growing growth areas in Melbourne's west.

LeadWest believes an improved bus network across the west is critical to improving accessibility to education and services, not just for students, but for all residents in the growth areas.

We will continue our advocacy to ensure that more is achieved for the whole of Melbourne's west.

ADVOCACY OFFICERS' ADVISORY GROUP

PLANNING ADVOCACY PRIORITIES AHEAD OF THE 2026 STATE ELECTION

The Committee has established an advocacy officers' advisory group which consists of advocacy officers from each of the member councils.

The group not only assists by providing regional knowledge but are also experts in issues impacting the member councils they represent.

The group meets every 6-8 weeks and their role includes making recommendations to the Committee about the determination and driving of strategic regional priorities; recommend actions on advocacy approaches and campaigns, draft position statements and contribute to the Strategic Plan and progress reports.
